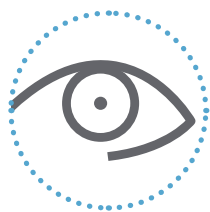


Important Safety Information

Accidental overdoses may happen!

It is very important to identify the signs of an overdose.

Here are some indications:



• Pinpoint pupils



• Unconsciousness



• Slowed or stopped breathing



• Lips or fingernails turning blue or gray

Respiratory Depression is one of the most dangerous symptoms because it can lead to not enough oxygen in your blood, which can cause permanent brain damage or even death.

Make sure that your family members and caregivers know how to tell if you are experiencing an overdose and what to do until emergency medical help arrives. You will probably be unable to treat yourself if you experience an opioid overdose.

If overdosing:

- Call 911
- Administer Naloxone to patient using the instructions given by doctor or pharmacist.
- If the person has stopped breathing or if breathing is very weak, begin CPR (best performed by someone who has training)
